

What vaccines does your dog need, and when?

Vaccines are the safest and most cost-effective way to protect your dog from many infectious preventable diseases, such as rabies, Lyme disease, canine distemper, and parvovirus—just to name a few.

Dog vaccinations are split into two categories: core vaccines and lifestyle vaccines.

Core vaccines

Core vaccines are required for all dogs and puppies.

Lifestyle vaccines

Lifestyle vaccines may be recommended based on factors such as your dog's lifestyle, where you live, or other additional factors.
