

What vaccines does your cat need, and when?



Making sure your cat has the vaccinations they need is a crucial part of being a pet parent.

Vaccines are the best way to protect your cat from contracting diseases such as feline leukemia (FeLV), rabies, and panleukopenia—just to name a few.

**FeLV: Feline Leukemia Virus. This is a core vaccine for kittens and a lifestyle (optional) vaccine for adult cats.

***Rabies: Vaccine renewal cadence may depend on state laws and your pet's health profile.

Core vaccines

Core vaccines are required for all cats and kittens.

Lifestyle vaccines

Lifestyle vaccines may be recommended by a vet based on factors such as your cat's lifestyle, where you live, or other additional factors.
